After 11 years teaching in the public school, and years spent getting a master's degree to be a principal,


Carrie was still transitioning to full-time life at home. She excitedly homeschooled our little boys by day and researched and planned curriculum by night.


as a graphic designer. Our third son, Greyson, graduated from our homeschool last year

Hearts for Him Through High School




Steps for Choosing the Correct Program

- Placement is key in Heart of Dakota. To help you decide where your child fits best, look at the "Program Selection Chart" at the bottom of this page.
- 2 If you have more than one child, consider the ages of your children. Think about whether you'd like to combine any of them within a program or keep them separate.
- As you can see by the chart below, based on your child's age he/she may fit in several different guides. For example, a 12 year old might fit in *Preparing Hearts for His Glory* or *Creation to Christ* in the extension range. This "extension range" might be used if you are trying to combine an older sibling with a younger one, or it might be used if you have a struggling learner. A 12 year old might also fit in *Resurrection to Reformation*, *Revival to Revolution*, or *Missions to Modern Marvels* in the target age range. The "target age range" is the more typical age range for a guide.
- 4 Once you see the group of guides where your child could place, you can move to the "Program Placement Chart" for that series to fine-tune your placement. An Overview of Our Programs



Each Heart of Dakota program was designed from the ground up to be educational, Christ-centered, easy-to-use, time-conscious and flexible. Using tried-and-true teaching practices and timeless learning methods, our guides combine living books and hands-on activities to offer a one-of-a-kind homeschool experience. When you use one of our programs, here is what you can expect to find:

Open-and-Go Daily Plans

Our programs are meant to save you time planning, so you can spend your time teaching and learning along with your children. Each program features a plan book (Teacher's Guide) with daily plans already written for you. These plans are designed for you to simply open up and teach. Subjects are rotated daily, so you are able to cover many areas that are often neglected, without lengthening your school day.

A Biblical Foundation

Our programs strive to keep God's Word at the heart of everything your children are learning. Whether it is character training, Bible study, or building a Christian worldview, we seek to make God's Word a priority in your child's life. As expectations build, skills and assignments your child has been trained to do are gradually handed over to be done independently. Our upper guides designate skills as being "teacher-directed," "semi-independent," and "independent." This pattern builds confident, selfsufficient learners who can learn for a lifetime!

Our Educational Philosophy



Our products are a result of many years of developing our personal belief system of how children learn. With over 30 years experience in education, Carrie has been fine-tuning her educational philosophy for decades. After II years teaching in the public school, earning a master's degree in educational leadership, and 20+ years of homeschooling, Carrie has used what she's learned to write Heart of Dakota guides from preschool through high school. You can read more about the philosophy that shaped our guides below.

Engage Their Minds, Capture Their Attention

When Carrie resigned after II years of teaching in the public schools to come home full-time, we knew that we wanted our children's education to be different. We did not wish to view our children as little vessels to fill with information. Instead, we wanted their learning to engage their minds, capture their attention, and spur them on to explore their interests and pursue their hobbies.

As we moved forward into homeschooling, we discovered some of the same philosophies Carrie had learned through public education and some she hadn't. We were especially drawn to the ideas put forth by Charlotte Mason and found ourselves agreeing with much of her philosophy of education.

We mainly focused on Charlotte Mason's concepts of short lessons and readings; selection of "living books" read purposefully over time; exposure to poetry, music, art, and nature; and her approach to language arts through narration, copywork, dictation, and memorization. Miss Mason's philosophy meant much more to us because of her personal belief that knowledge of God and His Word is foundational to all learning.

Address the Unique Needs of Varying Ages

As we added more children to our homeschooling family, we found that much of the traditional curriculum written for only one grade level did not fit our philosophy and was too time consuming for both Carrie and our children. We also knew we did not want an approach to education that was mainly focused on textbooks and workbooks.

When we tried using multi-level curriculums to combine our children in a variety of different ways, we had limited success. We found most multi-level curriculums were aimed at our older children, which left our little ones with no focused teaching time or personal attention. Consequently, the multi-age program that was supposed to unite all of us became fragmented. As we tried to adjust the material for our little ones, our older ones lost their focus.

With our past frustrations in mind, Carrie started putting together a learning program for our own children. We realized that trying to group a wide span of age levels together often left someone's needs unmet. This didn't match with our belief that the younger years are very important as habits are being formed and core learning is taking place. Likewise, the older years are also important, as children move toward gaining independence and learning to work toward a goal. So, Carrie began writing her own programs, with guides that used smaller age increments and still spanned several age levels. These guides went on to become the curriculum Heart of Dakota is known for today.

Build a Love for Christ and a Love for Learning

With the variety of homeschooling materials available today, it is easy to desire a Christian

education – yet end up with very few curriculum choices that are actually Christ-centered. To keep Christ at the center of our homeschool day, our guides place special emphasis on God's Word so all other learning radiates out from there. 

We believe that it is important to start with the Bible first and foremost, since it is truly the beginning of all history. This is why our youngest program, Little Hands to Heaven, is based on daily stories from God's Word and each day's activities revolve around the Bible story for that day.

Our next guide, Little Hearts for His Glory, gives a broad overview of history from Creation through present day and emphasizes God's plan throughout history. Overall in this guide, children learn a great deal of Bible history and U.S. history

- with brief introductions to a few famous people and world events.

Next, Beyond Little Hearts for His Glory and Bigger Hearts for His Glory move into American history for several reasons. After having our oldest son move through the time periods chronologically from the Ancients to the present, we found we would have preferred to wait to discuss myths, legends, other gods, and pagan cultures until he was older and more ready for these concepts. We also found the studies of the earlier time periods were often filled with weighty topics, barbaric behavior, and many stories of cruelty. Even in watered down fashion these don't seem to be appropriate topics for young children.

Instead, we wanted our young children to be inspired by stories of American heroes. We wanted to lead them to see God's providence in the history of our nation. Since the ancient times are so far removed from the world that we live in today, it seemed more logical to begin our study with the heritage that surrounds us daily. By reading history stories closer to the time period in which they live, students can enter the past and see it come to life.

In all of our guides, along with the history stories, we also incorporate hands-on activities. While kinesthetic learners especially benefit from this type of learning, all children enjoy variation in their day. Before you say that you aren't up to hands-on activities, you should know that all of our activities are written to be quick, educational, safe, easy to clean up, and require only items you readily have on hand.

> Additionally, Bible study, devotions, poetry and rhymes, music, timeline, narration, notebooking, geography activities – and in the upper programs - research,

projects, audios, drawing, primary source documents, discussions, and mapping are integrated with the history stories. Studies of the signers, presidents, and states are also included in various guides. This wellbalanced integration of subjects keeps learning fresh and interesting while encouraging students to make memorable connections.

Next in our guide sequence, with *Preparing Hearts*

for His Glory, we move into a one-year overview of world history. As biblical history is integrated into the narrative, students see that the flow of history is really one continuous story. This overview also gives students some "mental pegs" on which to hang information as they take an in-depth look at the various time periods in our guides for the middle years.

Our 4-year guide sequence for the middle school years takes a chronological, in-depth journey through the 4-year history cycle. Creation to Christ takes an intriguing, deeper look at the ancient time period by weaving Biblical history with secular history. Resurrection to Reformation focuses on the joy of Christ's Resurrection, along with life in the Middle Ages, the Renaissance, and the Reformation. Revival to Revolution studies the exciting time of the Great Awakenings through the Industrial

Revolutions. Finally, Missions to Modern

Marvels takes a look at modern missions and modern times. As part of the 4-year cycle, Biblical and American history are integrated with world history.

Our 4-year high school guide sequence begins by first exploring lands and seas from one end of the earth to the other via World

Geography. Next, in year two, students expand their horizons even further by setting off on a chronological, globe-trotting cultural adventure through World History. Moving on to year three, in U.S. History I students discover how our nation's story is full of both tragedies and triumphs along with hope for rekindled faith and patriotism. Finally, in U.S. History II, students end their high school journey by taking inspiration from those who envisioned a better country and in turn, encourage students to go forth themselves to boldly make a better tomorrow.

Science

For science, we want our young children to see the world as a fascinating miracle, rather than seeing science as a dry body of facts to be memorized. So, you'll discover that our programs for the early years focus on hands-on activities and experiments to help children appreciate the wonder of God's Creation.

In Little Hearts for His Glory and Beyond Little Hearts for His Glory, the science activities are linked to additional reading in a Christian Liberty science text. The goal is for children to be reminded of how amazing our Creator is and to learn to see His handiwork all around us. The connections between text and activity are at times loosely made in order to keep a hands-on science approach linked to a God-honoring text.

As children get older, and their attention span grows, so does their thirst for knowledge.

To encourage that desire, once children reach Bigger Hearts for His Glory, science becomes a daily subject. It is structured around daily reading assignments from a handful of fascinating

biographies and living books. Along with the readings, we include a combination of narration, notebook assignments with labeled drawings and copywork, and questions and experiments

with lab sheets emphasizing the scientific method. These activities are linked with the daily science readings. This pattern continues throughout Preparing Hearts for His Glory and during our four Hearts for Him Through Time guides for the middle years as well.

At this stage, it is easy to skip hands-on experiments or to get bogged down in complex explanations. So, our programs include handson science activities once or twice each week that will excite your scientist, without requiring additional preparation or planning from you.

All of our science activities are written to be quick, educational, safe, involve few directions, and require only items you readily have on hand. They have the added benefit of being written for your scientist to complete with minimal help from you. This saves you from having to "take over" dangerous

or complicated parts of an experiment. It also guards against your science activities becoming a demonstration that you end up doing while your child watches.

In our series for the middle years, narrative Christian texts paired with engaging scientific biographies keep science interesting. Creation to Christ emphasizes life science and biology. Resurrection to Reformation focuses on earth science including astronomy. Revival to Revolution features a physical science emphasis, complete with Exploration Education's unique modelbuilding kit along with a biographical inventors' study. Missions to Modern Marvels provides an introduction to chemistry, a fascinating look at creation vs. evolution, and the Chemistry C-500

In high school, we shift our focus to four years of college preparatory science. In year one, we pair wellknown author John Hudson Tiner's twelve

experiment kit along with

a Genetics & DNA kit.

Christian Integrated Physics and Chemistry booklets/ assessments with MicroPhySci's thirty-six labs. Next, in year two's Biology, we pair ACE's twelve visually appealing Christian PACEs with labs you can watch or perform. In year three, we introduce you to Dr. lay Wile's Discovering Design with Chemistry, which blends narrative text/detailed comprehension checks with forty-six experiments. Finally, in year four's Astronomy and Geology/Paleontology's course we offer a fresh alternative to physics! With ten fascinating Creation-based resources/DVDs, easily doable labs, and well-balanced assessments, we think you'll love finishing high school with this innovative course!

Language Arts

The area of Language Arts includes oral language, handwriting, spelling, writing, grammar, mechanics, usage, and vocabulary. Often, reading or literature study is placed under the language arts umbrella as well. In homeschooling our own sons, we found that if we weren't careful the area of language arts could either become a workbook nightmare or end up requiring hours of teaching time every school day. Either way, it can take up a large portion of the precious school day.

To address these concerns, you will find that our programs use a systematic approach to language arts. By rotating the teaching time for each area, the time spent daily on language arts is greatly reduced.

> For oral language, students memorize and recite weekly Scripture verses. They also learn to narrate or tell back what they've heard or read. Choral reading rhymes or

poetry each week focuses on another area of oral language practice. For handwriting, students work on copywork daily. For spelling, students focus on learning to spell a basic

body of frequently used words. Next, they move on to studied dictation to cement their spelling skills.

As students become more confident spellers, they are guided to complete specific, purposeful writing assignments. Students learn to write weekly written narrations and receive guided writing instruction in a variety of writing methods. For the purpose of becoming a better writer, students receive solid instruction in grammar, mechanics, and usage. Vocabulary study is addressed in our literature program and later along with our history and science topics.

Reading

Once your child is able to read independently there is a temptation to do one of the following two things: A) Send them off to read endlessly on their own with little or no accountability. B) Add so many activities or questions to the study of literature that there

is no room left to actually enjoy reading the book.

Our programs are written with the overall goal of gaining an appreciation of different types of literature. Short lessons and assignments foster understanding of the basic story elements without dissecting the text too far. Story discussions encourage shared enthusiasm for the story's plot. Narration practice solidifies understanding. And most importantly, weighing the character's actions in light of the Bible guides children to learn to read with discernment.

At Heart of Dakota, we love literature and all of its variety. We carefully screen thousands of books before choosing the quality literature we recommend in our programs. We look for books that will inspire or entertain without bringing in questionable content. Whenever possible, we try to include books that emphasize Godly character traits or that bring a historical time period to life. As an added benefit, just in case you may not always agree with our literature selections, many of our programs allow you to select your own literature for use with our guides.

Math

Math can either be an area of great frustration or of great joy. We have had both experiences in our homeschool. With our own children, we wanted math in the early years to be an enjoyable experience that fosters an "I can do this" attitude. It is so important to lay a solid foundation for later math concepts

It is also easy to go into overdrive with a mathematically gifted child without looking further down the road. It's important to use care not to overburden any child with too quick of a pace or with endless problems, until his/her enthusiasm eventually wanes or the understanding is lost in the shuffle.

without overwhelming the student.

Another concern is that many programs require so much teacher presentation time for math that if you have multiple students you could spend hours just presenting math lessons every day. We do enjoy teaching math at our house, but is that much presentation really necessary?

Our programs are written to balance quick, hands-on lessons with short written assignments. Together, these provide a firm foundation in mathematical thinking, without overwhelming the student or the teacher. As students move out of the primary years, the textbook replaces the hands-on learning, moving students from concrete to pictorial lessons instead. This allows students to visualize each concept prior to practicing it in their workbook. Short lessons also encourage more focused attention from the student which results in fewer mistakes and less reteaching. Our upper level math programs were selected to emphasize problem-solving and critical thinking, cement core math skills, and prepare students well for the future.

Bible Study

And finally, we come to the most important area in our programs: Bible study. While homeschooling our first son, we found it too easy to place Bible into one time slot and study it as a separate "subject". This made the Bible seem to be of equal importance as all of the other academic subjects. We wanted our children

> to know that the Bible is special and that it's more important than anything else. To do that, we realized the Bible needed to be integrated throughout our day as much as possible.

Our programs weave God's word throughout our readings, our poetry, our history, our science, our writing, our music, our study of English, and our memory work. Using this method, our children are

reminded to measure their thoughts, words, and deeds all throughout the day with God's word. Our programs also have a daily Bible study time, which we pray will train our children in the habit of seeking God's word daily.

In the hustle and bustle of the school day, it is easy to forget that our most important goal is to help our children glorify God with their lives each day. Our programs strive to be a daily reminder of that goal. Glorifying God is the only goal that matters for eternity.







Bible stories and other history stories are read aloud each day to provide a chronological overview of Biblical history to present day. The daily history stories provide the focus for the "Learning Through History" part of the plans.

Daily readings from beautiful living picture books work alongside the history spines to help students picture the past. Coordinating bookmarks add questions and a mystery picture activity.

Within each unit students discuss and memorize a Bible verse, read and apply a devotional, and focus on a Bible passage that corresponds with the history stories.




Now, why not take a quick peek at the Preparing Hearts for His Glory Teacher's Guide!

Bible stories interwoven with history stories provide a oneyear narrative overview of world history. Activities include questioning according to Bloom's taxonomy, Biblical applications, oral narration practice, and written narration lessons.

Three days per unit are devoted to a meaningful, hands-on project that brings the history story to life. Projects can be completed a little each day or in one session on Day 5.

Students will enjoy the poetry of Robert Louis Stevenson through choral reading, vocabulary, discussion, personal connections, sharing, and recitation of his classic poems.

Grammar lessons are planned using *Rod and Staff English*: Level 3 or 4. Studied dictation is scheduled 3 days in each unit to practice spelling skills. Drawn into the Heart of Reading provides 3 days of literature study. The remaining day in each unit is devoted to a creative writing lesson.



Independent, supplementary readings assigned from real books correspond with time periods being studied. Oral narration, copywork, notebook entries, and Biblical connections round out the independent readings.

Corresponding read-alouds make history come alive. Activities include oral narration as a character in the story, comparison to historical time periods, Biblical applications, and personal connections.

Lessons on beginning research skills, vocabulary, map and globe work, and timeline entries rotate throughout this part of the plans each unit. These coordinate with the history stories.

Each week, an experiment, a notebook entry, questions to answer (including Biblical application), and oral narration practice coordinate with the daily independent readings.

Engaging true stories provide a biographical approach to the time period of the Resurrection of Christ through the Reformation. Independent follow-up assignments include oral narrations, written narrations, Who's Who? entries of famous men and women, and mapping.

A Christian study of all fifty states, in the order of statehood, is scheduled three days in each unit. A state postcard and map of each state are included to summarize the building of our nation, the United States.

Engaging history read-alouds make text connections with the history themes of Revival to Revolution. Follow-up questions emphasize higher-level thinking to guide students to analyze, synthesize, narrate, and evaluate what was read.

Timeline entries, mapwork through Map Trek, classic poetry about historical events and people, and study of primary source documents rotate through this part of the plans in each unit. These activities coordinate with the history stories.

Additional resources that coordinate with the historical time period are included in the "Independent History Study" part of the plans. These include research on the signers of the Declaration of Independence, guided drawing lessons, audio presentations, copywork of verses and quotes, notebook entries, and black and white historical pictures for students to color.

Daily, students will use the Bible to complete an inductive study of the men and women of faith listed in Hebrews 11:1 - 12:3. By year-end, students will use Scripture Cards to memorize all of Hebrews 11:1-12:3, copy it, and form the habit of prayer within a daily quiet time.

Grammar lessons are planned daily with a choice of Rod and Staff English 5 or the first half of English 6. Three days each unit also include studied dictation to practice spelling and Drawn into the Heart of Reading to focus on in-depth literature study. Lessons from Imitation in Writing are also scheduled in each unit.

Education Exploration's Curriculum meets National Science Education Standards with its thorough textual material, hands-on experiments, and real-life projects in the area of physical science. Three days in each unit are devoted to the Standard Level study. Two additional days in each unit are scheduled for the Advanced Study.

A Biblical worldview study using Who is God?, and a music appreciation study using A Young Scholar's Guide to Composers, along with a variety of musical resources, alternate in this daily meeting time led by the parent.

Daily math lessons are scheduled in the Appendix for Singapore 6A/6B and Principles of Math: Book 1. Apologia Math, Mastering Essential Math Skills, and Understanding Pre-Algebra are also options.

The study of inventors focuses on fascinating, true-life stories of those who used innovation and scientific principles to pave the way for growth in power, manufacturing, production, communication, transportation, and more. Questions, narrations, and "Gallery" entries help students think deeply about the readings.

- Three days in each unit schedule a hands-on history project that brings the historical time period to life. Projects are scheduled to be completed a little at a time over three days.
- Three days in each unit schedule research from two different sources as part of a President Study. An optional study of your individual state is also recommended and scheduled one day in each unit.
- Engrossing history read-alouds make text connections with the history themes in Missions to Modern Marvels. Bookmark prompts target higher-level responses as students select lines to quote and comment upon, use quick sketches to provide visual commentary, ask clarifying and probing questions, make written connections, and share observations, reflections, and musings.

A historical and cultural view of world geography is provided through engaging stories that chronicle the history of exploration, discovery, and mapmaking. Independent follow-up assignments include various types of oral narrations, Expedition Journal


Literature's foundational elements of conflict, character, theme, point of view, structure and tone are taught in this course. Students respond to a wide variety of readings (including full-length novels) through literary analysis, Biblical worldview, and critical thinking questions; oral and written narrations; discussions; and Common Place Book entries.

Grammar lessons using the first half of Rod and Staff English 7 alternate with lessons from Essentials in Writing. Instruction in writing a research paper and in writing personal, persuasive, expository, and compare/contrast essays is provided.





A cultural approach to world history is integrated with Biblical and church history with readings about ancient cultures up through modern cultures. Follow-up assignments include written narrations, Book of Centuries, various types of oral narrations, World History Journal entries, and shared talking points.

School of Tomorrow's Biology (with anatomy) course is scheduled for this year of science. Follow up activity books, optional daily video lessons with professional footage of animals and plants, and complete labs performed online are also scheduled.

Key Idea: Complete Algebra II

United States history is covered from its pre-colonial days through the Civil War and Reconstruction period. Assignments include seven types of oral narrations, Book of Centuries entries, shared talking points with visual aids, U.S. History I Journal entries, and seven types of written narrations.

Independent history-based activities occur daily and range from viewing American Testimony video segments with corresponding viewing guides, using multiple resources to complete maps from U.S. History Map Activities, reading and responding to primary source documents from Great Documents in U.S. History and Great Letters in American History, and more.

Daily readings from the "Living Library" correspond with the history readings, providing a glimpse of life in a different time. Follow-up *Double-Entry Journal* assignments include selection of meaningful quotes or passages, brief contextual comments, and written personal commentary.

A conservative approach to Government is used to study the foundations, principles, and organization of government. Primary source documents, video instruction, activities, workbook assignments, and assessments are included. National standards for high school civics and government are covered.

A Foreign Language option using the last half of the Spanish Homeschool Curriculum Kit is scheduled daily. Emphasis is on new vocabulary, translation, conversation, Spanish grammar, and written language usage.

Three days in each unit focus on gaining Constitutional Literacy through learning the history, theory, and application of the Constitution. High quality video instruction by Michael Farris, along with coordinating workbook readings, case studies, vocabulary, study questions, and research assignments are part of the course.

Bible is scheduled daily using The Most Important
Thing You'll Ever Study: New Testament Survey which includes Scripture reading, reflection, study, and questions. Memorization, prayer journal entries, and hymns are also scheduled. A devotional Bible study with a girl option and a boy option are also part of Bible.

Dr. Wile's college-prepatory *Discovering Design with* Chemistry is scheduled for this year of science. The course includes a readable text with a strong mathematical component, comprehension check questions, step-by-step calculations, and expected experiment outcomes. Experiments are designed to be performed at home and are considered college-prepatory. A lab kit is available for use with the course.

A daily American Literature study incorporates 8 novels, 8 short stories, 4 famous primary sources, 1 full-length autobiography, and 1 play. Introductory notes, annotations, oral and written narrations, vocabulary work, Common Place Book entries, Literature Journal reflections, literary synthesis sheets, and literary discussions are part of the study.

Grammar lessons using the first half of Rod and Staff English 8 alternate with composition lessons from In Their Sandals. Writing skills include note-taking, writing from notes, telling narrative stories from varying viewpoints, coordinating multiple references, researching for reports, developing epistolary writing, and writing creatively as part of the writing process (i.e. research/prewrite, outline plot, develop descriptions, write, apply, revise).

Ideally students should be ready for Algebra II or Geometry or above. Recommended math suggestions are provided in the catalog and on our website.



United States history is covered from the Age of Reform (beginning in approximately 1877) through the World Wars and the Cold War to Modern Times. Assignments include eight types of oral narrations, Book of Centuries' entries, shared talking points with visual aids, U.S. History II Journal entries, and eight types of written narrations.

Independent history-based activities occur daily and range from viewing American Testimony video segments with corresponding viewing guides, considering varying viewpoints and weighing options to make historical decisions using Key Documents in U.S. History, reading and responding to primary source documents from Great Documents in U.S. History and Great Letters in American History, and more.

Daily readings from the "Living Library" correspond with the history readings, providing a glimpse of life in a different time. Follow-up *Triple-Entry Journal* assignments include selection of meaningful quotes or passages, brief contextual comments, and written personal commentary.

This study prepares young adults to defend their Christian faith by tackling the question of absolute truth, demolishing follies of postmodernism, and debunking moral relativism. A devotional Bible study with a girl option and a boy option are also part of Bible.

The focus of this year of science is a ½ credit of Astronomy and ½ credit of Geology/Paleontology. As students get ready to graduate and head into college or out into the workplace, this may be one of the few opportunities to study astronomy and geology/paleontology in a way that helps them defend what they believe and why when it comes to Scripture and science. A specialized lab kit from Quality it comés to Scripture and science. A speciálized lab kit from Quality Science Labs completes the course. All Science Package items are scheduled in the U.S. History II guide, including the labs.

A daily British Literature study incorporates novels, plays, poetry, short stories, and allegories. Timeless favorites like *Pride and* Prejudice, Jane Eyre, The Elusive Pimpernel, Hamlet, The Hound of Baskervilles, Prisoner of Zenda, and more are included.
