Now to give a snapshot of Drawn into the Heart of Reading: amazingly, this program is designed for grades 2-8. The teachers' guide covers all grades in one manual. The student books are broken down into three separate books: Levels 2 & 3, Levels 4 & 5, and Levels 6, 7, & 8.

Nine genre units covered are:

- Historical Fiction
- Fantasy
- Mystery
- Folk Tales
- Nonfiction
- Humor
- Realistic Fiction

Some of the types of activities included are: pre-reading activities, guided literature discussions, evaluation of a character's actions in light of God's word, and creative projects.
